

### FROM THE PRESIDENT



Mother Nature sure gave us a mixed bag of weather to start the spring season. The Zone 2 PCA DE at Virginia International Raceway had the best conditions I've ever experienced for that event. The sun shone and daytime temperatures were in the mid to upper 70s, quite a contrast to the usual rain and frequently frigid temps. Shenandoah had a strong showing of drivers and supporters. Fellow member Jim Ottawav tried his first DE, and son Kyle served as pit crew. See Kyle's article in this issue to read a teen's take on his first trip to the track. Member Bates McLain, a veteran vintage Morgan racer, tried his first PCA DE in his newly painted 944, and Hamish Brookeman got promoted to the white group.

The weekend after the Zone 2 DE, Rick Ebinger and Erik Boody had planned an Autocross Test, Tune, and School for March 27 to introduce new and inexperienced drivers to autocrossing and to get the old pros in shape for the season. Mother Nature was not happy that weekend and gave us snow and very cold temperatures. With the threat of a winter storm warning and the possibility of five inches of snow, we decided to cancel the event.

A couple of weeks later Rick and Erik rebounded with the help of co-sponsors Mark Cooke of Euroclassics Porsche and Jack Woodfin of G-Force Karts to host an outstanding autocross at the Richmond International Raceway. (See Rick's article and the autocross results in this issue.) I was rather intimidated by the venue at first. The banked turns and concrete walls made images of spectacular NASCAR crashes race through my mind. But Rick and Erik put together an exciting, challenging, and safe course; and there were no metalbending incidents. One of my favorite parts of the event was the practice area. Participants took turns going around a short course to warm their tires and themselves up. Toward the end of the day Rick took the cones up, but I continued to practice. I had a great time making up my own patterns and working on smoothness, but also accelerating hard, braking hard, turning abruptly, and rocking the car iust to see what it (and I) would do under those conditions. Autocrosses and driver's education events are a tremendous amount of fun but are also valuable events for improving your driving skills and learning the

limits of you and your car in safe and controlled environments. Our next autocross is at the Augusta Government Center in Verona on May 14. Online registration is now open at MotorsportReg.com.

Our tour co-chairmen, Dan Graff and Bates McLain arranged for a picture-perfect spring day at the Millmont Grille in Charlottesville to hold our first Porsches and Pastrami Reloaded. Many new members, the regulars, and even a prospective member from Fredericksburg came out to have lunch on the patio and go for a scenic drive to Stanardsville for ice cream at the Dairy Queen. (See photos in this issue.)

Gary Hagar was the originator of Porsches and Pastrami and our gracious host at Durty Nelly's Pub for two years. When Gary decided he would not be able continue this very popular event, Dan and Bates took over. Many thanks to Gary for starting this tradition and to our tour co-chairs for continuing it.

Our club historian Harry Kennison has written another Shenandoah history quiz that will challenge our memories. Answers can be found toward the end of this issue. Bruce Russell will give us some tips for preparing our Porsches for the driving season with his "Russ's Ramblings" this month.

Upcoming events you don't want to miss are the open house at Foreign Affairs in Staunton on April 30; the Bavarian Chef Drive and Dine planned for May 1 that will start with a wine tasting at Sweely Estate Winery, continue with a scenic driving tour, and end appropriately for us Porschephiles with a German dinner at the Bavarian Chef; more autocrosses; Shenandoah's signature production in it's fifteenth year, the Richmond Porsche Meet (RPM) on June 10-12; and the Porsche Parade in Savanna, GA July 31-August 6.

Another event you may want to attend is the Zone 2 PCA Club Race and Advanced DE at VIR near Danville on June 24-26. Even if you don't drive, you can watch the excitement of the colorful, well-tuned cars as they vie for position around the track or volunteer and get close to the action. Last but not least, a big thank you to Pam Ebinger who served as secretary of Shenandoah for two plus years. For personal reasons she decided to step down, and past president Herb Distefano has agreed to serve in her place.

### **RIR, RICHMOND INTERNATIONAL RACEWAY 2011**

With rain in the forecast, we were worried. We have raced for the last six years, since we purchased the box for the autocross equipment and have never had to put away wet. This event had drizzle during set up on Friday, cloudy and overcast all day Saturday, and rain about 30 miles west of Richmond when we finished packing up. Dodged a bullet, and for the 46 racers who came out, they had one really wild day.

Trying to change things and raising the challenge levels, we were able to have a 10 gate staggered slalom, a Chicago box in the middle of turn 1 that was diagonal to the track, off camber, and climbing the 14 degree banked turn, a straightaway between turns 2 and 3 good for 100 MPH, and a quick flowing course. We were happy how it turned out, and I was able to run almost all of it in third; it raised the level needed to go fast on this course. Thank you Mark with Euroclassics and Jack of G-Force Karts for sponsoring this great event and bringing it back from its two-year hiatus.

With 46 racers we had a full day ahead of us, even though we started at 9:30 AM. The practice track in the infield stayed busy throughout the day, and we had some new cars and fast drivers ioin us for the day. The top car of the day was a Lotus Stalker that could not have weighed 1,100 pounds, had Hoosiers, and a driver who knew how to drive. We had well-driven Corvettes and a Viper, and Jonathan Newhall figured out how to make his Jaguar go fast instead of round and round like he has been known to do in Staunton. Jeffrey Elmore had a great day in a very well prepared Boxster that has a great sound to it. He will be one to watch this year, as I expect he will be battling for the top spot all this summer. We had a Lemons 944 that was fun to watch, but it couldn't have been but so much fun to drive with the cracked windshield and wagging tail of the car. Erik and Jack both said they had fun driving it, but I reserve my opinion on that thing. We also had many nice Caymans in the group, and they performed very well. Great cars. We even had a 2007 Mercedes E63 that ran very well on the banked turns and especially down the straightaway. Everyone ran well, and as usual, we had some spins and thrills. We had the GTO punt the timing gear at the finish line, but luckily, once the battery holders were straightened, it worked the rest of the day. We did have one other hiccup: the timing gear went nuts at 1 PM. Apparently there was another car group outside the stadium that was using the same brand of timing gear as we were, and since the range on the wireless is about 2 miles, we could not figure out why we had starts and stops that we had never seen before. We made it work with a wired system, and then back to the wireless system once the other group turned off their wireless system. Thanks to John Kessler and his wonderful daughter who ran a stopwatch for us while we changed things around to get the timer working. Great job you two. Paul Sponseller is slipping up the pack, finishing ahead of 17 others. Great job Paul and good improvement on not an easy track!

Thanks to the helpers and all those who help put this great event together. Thank you to Mark, Jack, and Alex for the support and vision to pull this off. If we do it again, and you like cars and going fast, don't let this great event escape you. You won't be sorry. Stay tuned for the next event coming soon.

### MY FIRST WEEKEND AT THE TRACK

My first weekend at the track was an event I will never forget. When my dad first came to me asking if I wanted to go to VIR with him for a few days I didn't know what to think. So I said "sure", thinking that he wasn't really serious - but it turns out he was deadly serious as he had already planned out where we would stay, all the logistics about getting there, and making sure he didn't have to work that weekend.



When we first arrived in Danville, we pulled into the hotel parking lot thinking that there were going to be Porsches everywhere getting ready for the next day. But there were none. On the first day we learned how to properly approach a corner and pass through it at the highest speed with maximum grip. We learned everything from track etiquette and when to pass to the amount of Gs achieved while cornering.

The highlight of the trip for me was being able to ride with my dad during the charity laps to see and experience the track for myself. Although they were low speed laps, I got the feeling of what it is like to be on a closed course. Even though I cannot participate in an event like that one for another two years, I cannot wait until I can. First I need to work on getting a driver's license.





Mary Jean and I went on the Highland Maple Festival tour and had a ball. The last time I went to the maple festival was around 1981. Let's just say it has grown in popularity over the ensuing years. Deane Parker did a wonderful job of planning and leading us on a beautiful mountain drive on a beautiful day.

We opted not to eat the pancake lunch at Blue Grass, so we drove back into Monterey. Parking was a bit of a problem, so after driving around town we decided to head over to McDowell. We were sitting at the main stop light in Monterey, and a Virginia State Trooper suddenly walks over to my car. I knew what he was going to say because I have a German license plate on the front of my car. To my surprise, he stooped down and said. "This is a really nice car. I bet you had a ball coming over the mountain." Phew, I dodged another bullet!

Before moving to the featured topic of the month, let me tell you our experience with those ever-elusive "world-class" Maple Donuts. When we got to McDowell, we parked and strolled around checking out all the local vendors. One of the vendors was in front of a store about a block off Route 250. She had

boxes of Maple Donuts sitting on a table. There was no line so we purchased a dozen of those rare, and much sought after golden delicacies. I am not going to say the box was empty by the time we arrived back in Richmond, but darn close! I must admit, they are good.

This is the time of year when I give my Porsche its thorough spring cleaning. I am not a Concours fanatic, but I do like my car to look nice. I did enter my Carrera in the national Concours competition at the 1999 Porsche Parade in Mont Tremblant, Quebec. What a humbling experience. I had two 1989 Speedsters parked on either side of me. One had 49 miles on the odometer and the other had 110 miles! They looked like they were still on the showroom floor. Needless to say, they did very well in the competition.

I though I would share some tips and techniques I have learned over the years. I perform this cleaning ritual twice a year, in the spring and in the late fall. First, the exterior is washed, polished, and waxed and the wheels are washed and waxed. All of the exposed rubber trim and the vinyl targa top are cleaned and treated. Next, I vacuum the interior; clean and treat the leather seats and vinyl trims and shampoo the carpets and mats.

Let me share with you some of the products I use to keep my car looking nice. I am well aware that everybody has his or her

favorite cleaners, waxes, shampoos, etc., and that is fine. The information I am going to share are my personal favorites that have served me well over the years.

Most of my car care products come from Car Care Specialties in Lodi, NJ. Larry Reynolds (owner) carries a wide range of car care products and his website is full of helpful hints and recommendations. Check out their website at: HYPERLINK "http://www.carcareonline.com" www.carcareonline.com.

OK, let's get started. First, let me say that you should always wash, polish, and wax your car in a shaded or cool location. If you place your hand on the hood and it feels hot, it is to hot to wash and wax. I usually wash the car in the early morning or late evening. I then polish and wax the car inside my garage and out of direct sunlight.

My preferred car washes are Meguiars #62 Carwash or P21S Bodywork Shampoo. Do not use household dish soap unless you want to strip off all the wax on your car. After washing and thoroughly drying the car, I polish the paint with 3M Imperial Hand Glaze. I apply the glaze with a low-speed orbital buffer and remove it by hand with 100% cotton towels. This step removes all the fine scratches, swirl marks and "dead" paint from the surface of the car. There are many different types and "grits" of car polish. I have found that Imperial Hand Glaze is an

excellent compromise and serves my purposes well.

Now let us talk about wax. I could write a book about all the waxes I have tried over the years. Some of you "senior" members may remember the original Blue Coral wax treatment that came packaged in two separate glass bottles; we have come a long way since then. My two favorite waxes are both carnauba-based products – One Grand Blitz Carnauba Wax and P21S Concours Carnauba Wax. Both of these products are paste waxes that go on very easily and are buffed off with 100% cotton towels. The application and removal of wax is done by hand. I would not recommend using buffing cloths or towels that are a "blend" of cotton and synthetic fibers. The reason is the synthetic fibers (usually polyester) will actually make hairline scratches in your paint.

When I wash the car, the last step is to thoroughly clean my Fuchs wheels. I use P21S High Performance Wheel Cleaner because it is pH-balanced and will not stain or harm anodized or clear-coated wheels. I also put a coat of carnauba wax on my clean wheels whenever I wax the body of the car. I apply wax to both the black painted centers and the anodized rims. I usually take the wheels off the car to wax them because it is easier for me. I must confess that my neighbors think I am a bit "strange" when they see me waxing wheels.

Porsche actually recommends putting a thin coating of Vaseline on anodized wheels. The Vaseline attracts every speck of brake dust and road grit, and your wheels will look dirty in very short order. I and many other Porsche owners have "passed" on the Vaseline recommendation.

Before moving to the interior, I finish off the exterior rubber trim and vinyl targa top with Lexol Vinylex Protectant that comes in a pump spray bottle. Years ago, I used Armor-All, but I discovered that Armor-All contained a high concentration of liquid silicone. Silicone on rubber is not good, so I stopped using Armor-All. I do not know if Armor-All still uses silicone in their rubber-treatment product, but I now only use Vinylex on my cars. The added benefit is Vinylex leaves a nice non-glossy sheen on rubber and vinyl.

The interior is fairly simple relative to the exterior. All of the interior vinyl surfaces (i.e. dashboard, door panels, etc.) are wiped down with Lexol's Vinylex. My leather seats get a two-stage treatment. First, I clean the seats with a rag, warm water and Lexol pH Leather Cleaner. After drying the seats with a towel, I apply Lexol Leather Conditioner and let it soak into the leather. Lexol makes some outstanding products and I encourage you to give them a try.

Finally, I shampoo my carpets and floor mats. There is a company named Chem-Dry that primarily does commercial and household carpet cleaning. They also make and sell a spray can of their commercial carpet cleaner and stain remover. This stuff is the best carpet cleaner/stain remover for automotive carpets that I have ever found. I first spray the carpet and mats (first, remove the mats from the car) and let them sit for a minute or two. I then take a stiff-bristle brush and scrub the carpets and mats. To finish, I wipe down the carpets/mats with a damp rag or small towel. Be forewarned, Chem-Dry spray carpet cleaner is hard to find. I usually buy a couple of cans whenever the Chem-Dry folks come and clean our household carpets.

Well, that's it. Sounds like a lot of work, but it is really not too bad. It usually takes me a full day to perform the semi-annual cleaning which I have outlined above. I must admit that I work at the "AARP" pace and stop frequently for cold malted refreshments and to just goof off.

That's about all for now. Have a good month and I will "ramble" with you again in May.
